











TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE PROVISION OF INTERNATIONAL TRAINING SERVICES IN ESG ASSESSMENT

Background

Caritas Czech Republic in Mongolia implements the "Switching on the Green Economy" (SOGE) project, funded by the European Union's Switch Asia program, from 2022 to 2025, along with 3 project partners: People in Need INGO, Mongolian Sustainable Finance Association NGO (MFSA), and Development Solutions NGO. The goal is to encourage a gradual shift to a low-carbon, resource-efficient circular economy in Mongolia through introducing eco-labelling and green certification to the Mongolian market.

As part of the project activities, the project team is seeking an international training service provider or an independent consultant with expertise in training, consulting, and/or verification and validation in alignment with internationally recognized ESG standards, policies, and processes. The selected training provider will deliver capacity-building programs for local ESG consultants, equipping them to assist 20–30 local MSMEs and retailers in implementing ESG standards within their operations. Additionally, the training provider will train local ESG verifiers to conduct ESG verifications/audits for the same group of MSMEs and retailers. The target MSMEs and retailers will be producers in the agri-food and beverage sector, excluding meat and milk-related production.

Training deliverables

The selected training provider or independent consultant will deliver production-focused Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) training sessions as outlined below to approximately 30 local ESG consultants and 30 ESG verifiers:

3	On-site ESG mentoring and workshops for local ESG consultants (5-7 days)	The international consultant should visit Mongolia 1.5 months after the online training to assess and advise on the ESG consulting activities of the local consultants. This will include selecting 2-4 MSMEs to visit the MSMEs to review their ESG implementation and provide recommendations to the organizations and consultants to improve implementation. This task should use an appropriate combination of MSME office, factory visits and training workshops.	March-April, 2025
4	Online ESG verification training for local verifiers (5 days)	The content includes ESG verification processes enhanced with case studies, as well as a range of supporting documents, tools, and additional resources to ensure a comprehensive understanding and application.	April-May, 2025

The total working time will be approximately 23 working days including 7 working days of incountry time required for the tailored training service and preparation time.

ESG assessment development:

ESG assessment tool: Currently, MFSA has developed a production-based ESG assessment tool with over 170 criteria as part of the SOGE project. This tool is based on a combination of international and local standards, including the ISO 14001 family, WBA, ESRS, SASB, GRI, Malaysian Simplified ESG Disclosure Guidance, UN Global Compact, and MFSA's ESG Reporting Guidelines. The assessment questionnaires are designed to measure the sustainability maturity level of target MSMEs using the PDCA (Plan-Do-Check-Act) cycle framework. Accordingly, the selected international trainer should focus on aligning their ESG training and workshops with this assessment tool to ensure consistency and relevance (Please refer to Annex 3)

Post-Training activities: Following the training activities, MSFA will manage the verifiers responsible for second-party verification of the selected 20-30 MSMEs. Additionally, the ESG assessment will be further developed and piloted in connection with the newly introduced ESG-linked loans and sustainability-linked loans in Mongolia.

Category A (Training service provider - Company)

Qualifications of the Training Service Provider:

- A minimum of 10 years of experience in sustainability (ESG) standards;
- Specialised focus on training services related to topics such as GHG emission, energy, waste management, PEF standards, water management, sustainability management, occupational safety and health (OHS), human resources, human rights, gender and corruption;

The training provider must have at least one professional trainer who meets the following qualifications:

- Proficiency in verbal and written professional English skills;
- A minimum of 6-8 years of experience in ESG (environment, social, and governance);
- A Master's degree in environmental management, sustainability, or a related field;
- Experience in mentoring or clearly communicating complex ideas;

- Experience conducting ESG and sustainability assurance activities, including remote documentation review, onsite audits, and audit program management.
- Preferable if the trainer has teaching and verification experience in relative, similar frameworks, and key ESG topics;
